A PROCLAMATION.

For a Bank Holiday.

VICTORIA, R.

We, taking into Our consideration that it is desirable that Wednesday the twelfth day of May instant, should be observed as a Holiday in the City of Liverpool, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of 'The Bank Holidays Act, 1871,' to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that Wednesday the twelfth day of this instant May, be appointed a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Liverpool, and We appoint Wednesday aforesaid to be observed accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace,
this sixth day of May, in the year of

Our Lord One thousand eight hundred
and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year
of Our Reign.
