THE Queen has been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for presenting the Reverend William John Scott, B.A., to the Vicarage of Hempton, in the County of Norfolk, and Diocese of Norwich, void by the resignation of the Reverend Ambrose James Johnson, B.A., the last Incumbent.
