BRITISH CLAIMS AGAINST COLOMBIA.

NOTICE is hereby given that all British subjects having claims against the Government of Colombia, arising out of the late Revolution in that Republic, should forthwith transmit direct to Mr. William J. Dickson, Her Majesty's Minister at Bogota, for presentation to the Colombian Government, their statements of claim, together with certificates and vouchers in support of them, duly authenticated, and the necessary proofs of their British nationality.

Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid has announced that Certificates of Origin are not required in Cuba and Porto Rico for Goods conveyed to those Islands in British vessels.
