A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS by Section 2 of 'The Customs Amendment Act, 1886,' We are authorised from time to time to make, and when made, revoke a Proclamation prohibiting the importation into Our United Kingdom of such Coins coined in a foreign country as are in that behalf specified in such Proclamation; and it is by the said Section enacted, that while such Proclamation is in force the Coins therein specified shall be goods prohibited to be imported as if they were specified in Section 42 of 'The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876.'

And whereas We have deemed it expedient, with the advice of Our Privy Council, to make Proclamation accordingly.

Now, therefore, with the advice of Our Privy Council, We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, prohibit the importation into Our United Kingdom of all Coins coined in any foreign country, other than Gold or Silver Coins.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this twentyfifth day of March, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eighth hundred and eighty-seven, and in the fiftieth year of Our Reign.
