IT is hereby notified that the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin, stating that Foreigners wishing to reside in certain districts of Germany must be furnished with passports or nationality certificates. Under these circumstances the attention of the public is called to the notice which appeared in the London Gazette of July 18, 1884.

All British subjects intending to visit Germany are again recommended to provide themselves with passports.
