Venice, May 7. Some Days ago Cavalier Mo-cenigo fet out with the Character of Ambaffador Extraordinary from this Republick to the King of the Two Sicilies, as did Sig. Tiepolo with that of Ambaffador to his most Christian Majesty.

Venice, May 15. A few Days ago died here, in a very advanced Age, Cavalier Emo, Procurator of St. Mark's.

Hague, May 27. By the last Accounts from Prince Ferdinand's Army, we have the News, that they encamped, on the 20th instant, on the Heights of Fritzlar, and were reviewed on the following Day by his Serene Highness, who had the Satisfac-tion to find the Troops in the best Order imaginable. General Imhoff and General Gilfoe command each a detached Corps, the first upon the Ohme, and the latter upon the Fulda near Hirschfeld. Nothing had happened but fome Skirmishes with Colonel Freytag's Corps, which had all turned to our advan-

tage. The two Regiments of British Cavalry arrived in the Wefer, and lay fome Leagues below Bremen on the 17th, and are now upon their March to join Prince Ferdinand's Army. We have likewife Ad-vice, that the Corps of British Infantry, under the Command of Major General Griffin, arrived fafe in the Wefer, off Giertendorff, on the 22d Inftant, having fortunately escaped a violent Storm, which came on scon after. We don't learn, that Marshal Broglio has hitherto made any Motions; or that any material Alterations have happened in the Politions of the Auftrian or Pruffian Armies in Saxony.
