The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

7 HEREAS the Time limited by His late Majesty's Order in Council of the 25th of April last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant October-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majelly's Ser-vice, and the Safety of this Kiugdom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome longer Time His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Master General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 29th Day of this Instant October, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refrective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninch Year of His late Majefty's Reign, entituled, " An Act to impower His Majefty to pro-" hibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce " the Law for impowering His Majefty to prohibit " the Exportation of Gulpowder, or any Sort of " Arms and Ammunition ; and also to impower His " Majefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt "Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-inition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Ma jetty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter Gene-'ral of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as 'to them may respectively appertain.

The following Act was paffed in the Parliament of Ireland in the First Year of His late Majesty's Reign, Viz.

An Act to continue the Parliament for the Time being on the Demife of His prefent mefl gracious Majefly, or on any of Ilis Heirs or Succ. fors, for the Term of Six Months from the Day of the faid Demije ; And like-wife to provent the Publick Funds from expiring during the Jaid Term. OR the better Security of the Protestant Interest

OR the better Security of the suc-in this Kingdom of Ireland, and of the Succeffion to the Crown of Great Britain and Ireland, in the Protestant Line ; Be it Enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That this prefent Parliament, or any other Parliament which shall bereafter be fummoned and called by His prefent Majelly, His Heirs or Succeffors, shall not be determined or diffolved by the Death or Demife of His faid Majefly, His Heirs or Successors ; but fuch Parliament shall and is hereby Enacted to continue, and is hereby impowered and required, if fitting at the Time of fuch Demile, immediately to proceed to act, not-withstanding fuch Death or Demile, for and during the Time of Six Calender Months and no longer. unlefs the fame fhall be fooner proregued or diffolved by fuch Perfon to whom the Crown of Great Britain. and Ireland shall defcend, remain, and be, according to the feveral Acts made in Great Britain for limiting and fettling the Succeffion thereof in the Proteftant Line : And if the faid Parliament shall be for prorogued, then it shall meet and fit upon the Day unto which it shall be prorogued, and continue for the Refidue of the fame Time of Six Calender Months; unlefs fooner prorogued or diffolved as aforefaid.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority afore. faid, That if there be a Parliament in Being at the Time of the Death of His Majefty, His Heirs or Successions, but the fame happens to be feparated by Adjournment, fuch Parliament shall immediately after fuch Demife, meet, convene, and fit, and shall act notwithstanding such Death or Demise, for and during the Time of Six Calender Months and no longer, unless the fame shall be fooner prorogued or dillolved as aforefaid.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if there be a Parliament in Being at the Time of the Death of His Majefly, His Heirs or Succeffors, but the fame happens to be feparated by Prorogation, fuch Parliament may, notwithflanding fuch Death or Demile, meet and convene at fuch Time within the faid Six Calender Months, and at fuch Place as the Perfon to whom the Crown of Great Britain and Ireland fhall defcend, remain, and be as aforefaid, fhall appoint by Proclamation, and may act during the Refidue of the faid Six Calender Months, next after fuch Death or Demife, and no longer, unless the fame be fooner prorogued or diffolved as aforefaid.

And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That in Cafe there is no Parliament in Being at the Time of fuch Death, or Demife, that has met, and fat, then the last preceding Parliament may convene and sit at such Time, within Six Calendar Months, and at fuch iPlace and the Performent whom the Crown of Great Britani and Iteland thall defeend, remain, and base parcerstaid, fh.ul íh.dl
