and 4900 wounded; befides 1500 which are taken Prifoners. No Calculation has yet appeared of the Number of killed and wounded on the Side of the Austrians. The King of Prussia himself had a flight Contustion on the Breast by a Musclet Shot; and Marshal Daun was obliged to retire from the Field of Battle, by a Wound he received on the Thigh.

Hague, Nov. 24. By the laft Accounts from Sax-ony we find, That the King of Pruffia, in Confequance of his Victory on the 3d, was drawing near Dreiden with his Army; and that, after having quitted Meifien, he had advanced to Unkerfdorff, and that fome of his Troops had actually taken Possession of Freyberg: So that his Prussian Majedy's Polition was nearly the fame, as at the Opening of the prefent Campaign. Our last Advices, relating to the Russians, men-

tion, with Confidence, their Retreat towards the Visula, and the Generals Czernichew and Tottlebon having actually evacuated all the Places, they had, in Brandenburgh ; as also some Advantages, which General Werner had gained over fome Ruffian Parties in their Retreat.

The Hereditary Prince of Brunfwick, we hear, was still at Klein-Reckum, on the 22d Instant;

Branfruick, Now. 21. We have received Information, That Prince Ferdinand of Brunswick had quitted his Head Quarters at Ovilgunne, and paffed the Wefer, and was actually on the 18th at Uflar; from whence it is supposed, that some vigorous Attempts will be made to diflodge the French from the Posts they occupy on this Side of the River We-fer. The Generals Diepenbreek and Luckner are, it is faid, ordered from the Side of the Hartz, to fecond his Screne Highnefs's Operations.

Admiralty Office, December 2.

Capt. Bentinck, of His Majefty's Ship the Niger, gives an Account, in his Letter dated in Flymouth Sound, the 27th of last Month, that on the 24th in the Morning he fell in with a Snow, which he chafed till Eight o' Clock at Night, when he took her: She proved to be the Eprecuc, a Frigate of about 200 Tons, 14 Six Pounders, and 136 Men, belonging to the French King, commanded by Monf. Le Picquier, Lieutenant, and failed from Morlaix the Night before fhe was taken.

Capt. Ourry, of His Majefly's Ship Actæon, gives an Account, in his Letter dated the 28th of laft Month, that he had given Chafe that Morning to a French Brig Privateer, which he foon came up with, and took : She is called the Phœnix, belong-ing to Morlaix, of 12 Carriage and 12 Swivel Guns, and 120 Men.
