E, taking into Our most ferious Confi-deration the just and necessary War in

which We are engaged with the French King, and putting Our Truft in Al-mighty God, that He will vouchfafe a fpecial Bleffing on Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy-Council, hereby command, That a Publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called England, Our Domi-nion of Walcs, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Friday the Thirteenth Day of February next ; That to both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Parden of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments, which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have mest justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affistance on Our Arms, and for refloring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Profpe-rity to Us, and Our Kingdoms : And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed. as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Pu-nifhment as We may juftly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo Religious and Neceflary a Duty. And, for the better and more orderly Solemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick Worship; and to take Care the same be timely dispersed throughout their respective Diocefes.

and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affiltance on Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity, to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do ftrictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devouily observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, as they terder the Fa-vour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo Religious and Necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We charge, That incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, Ye pafs to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful; and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks whom We ordain to fee the fame publified; and We appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day abovemen-tioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.
