We do with great Pleafure hear of your Majefty's Filial Love and Piety; Your Humanity and Respect to the different Orders of Men. These were Virtues confpicuous in the Manners of the Prince your Father, and are to us the certain Tokens of a good Heart. These natural and inbred Principles have been improved with Age, and you have, at proper Seafon, transplanted them into Life, that they may become the prevailing Maxims of your Government, and adorn the Annals of your Reign.

WE your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-W jects, the Lord-Lieutenant, Nobility, High Sheriff, Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Norfolk, filled with a due Senfe of the many Bleffings derived to us from your Majefty's Illuftrious House, embrace this first Opportunity of a General Meeting of our County, to unite in professing our Sorrow for the Death of our late most gracious Sovereign; an Event, which your Majesty has piously declared to be a Lois to yourfelf, as well as your People.
