A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of His Council of both Kingdoms, for certain weighty and urgent Occasions concerning His Majesty and this State, and the Defence of this Realm of Ireland, and the Church of the same, hath Ordained that a Parliament be held in this Kingdom, and there to have Conference with the Prelates, Peers, and other Great Men of the said Kingdom concerning the same.

These are therefore to publish and make known, by this Our Proclamation, His Majesty's Pleasure in that Behalf, and that the said Parliament is to be held at *Dublin*, on Tuesday the Nineteenth Day of *May* next; for Summoning of which Parliament Writs will be issued, bearing Test on Tuesday the Seventh Day of this Instant *April*; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice.

G O D Save the K I N G.

Copenhagen, March 31. This being the King of Denmark's Birth-Day, and his Majesty not being yet able to come to Town, the Foreign Ministers are all invited to a Concert in the Prince Royal's Apartments this Evening, and are afterwards to sup with his Royal Highness.

Hamburg, April 7. According to Advices from Upper Silesia of the 22d past, General Drakowitz, who commands in that Part of the Country, the Austrian Corps of Troops of between 5 and 6000 Men, had detached towards Italy two Regiments of Cuirassiers of Bathiani and Toscana.

Hague, April 10. The Marquis of Granby arrived here this Evening in his Way for England.

They write from *Cologne* of the 6th Instant, that Count Konigsfegg, Great Dean of the Chapter, was unanimously chosen Elector of *Cologne* that Morning.

By the last Letters from the Army we understand, that every Thing was quiet, and all the Troops were going into Cantonments.

We have an Account from the Empire, that Major General Schenkendorff, with a Body of Prussians, had attacked, in the Neighbourhood of *Saalfeld*, a Detachment of the Army of the Circles, consisting of six Battalions, and 800 Horse, had totally defeated them, having taken one Colonel, one Major, 27 other Officers, 800 Men, 6 Cannons, and 4 Standards. All the rest of that Corps were cut to Pieces, or dispersed.
