WHEREAS His Majefly, by and with the Advice and Confent of His Council of both Kingdoms, for certain weighty and argent Occasions concerning His Majefty and this State, and the De-fence of this Realm of Ireland, and the Church of the fame, hath Ordained that a Parliament be held in this Kingdom, and there to have Conference with

the Prelates, Peers, and other Great Men of the faid Kingdom concerning the fame.

Thefe are therefore to publish and make known, by this Our Proclamation, His Majefty's Pleafure in that Behalf, and that the faid Parliament is to be held at Dublin, on Tuefday the Nineteenth Day of May next; for Summoning of which, Parliament Writs will be iffued, bearing Teft on Tuefday the Seventh Day of this Inftant April; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice.

By the last Letters from the Army we understand, that every Thing was quiet, and all the Troops were going into Cantonments.

We have an Account from the Empire, that Major General Schenkendorff, with a Body of Pruffians, had attacked, in the Neighbourhood of Saalfeld, a Detachment of the Army of the Circles, confifting of fix Battalions, and 800 Horfe, had totally defeated them, having taken one Colonel, one Major, 27 other Officers, 800 Men, 6 Cannons, and 4 Standards. All the reft of that Corps were cut to Pieces; or difperfed.
