Nor could any thing alleviate the Sorrow which we feel on the fudden Lofs of fo gracious a King, in the full Career of Glory, Honour, and Succefs, but the Confideration that his Sceptre hath devolved to a Prince, whole early Virtues and known Affection to his People and Native Country, afford the most agreeable Presages that he will magnanimously pursue the Vigor and Wisdom of those Measures, by which his illustrious Progenitor became feared abroad, and beloved at home.

May your Majesty be graciously pleased to accept of our fincere Congratulations on your happy Acces fion to the Government of fo great a People, with our fervent Prayers that your Keign may be long and happy over them; and may we be permitted, in all Humility, to add the most earnest Assurances of our continual Endeavours to demonstrate our Loyalty, Duty, and Obedience, by every Act in our Power.

To the King's most Excellent Majefty,

The humble Address of the Mayor, Capital Burgeffee, and Freemen, of the Borough of Camelford.

WE your Majefty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, the Mayor, Capital Bucgeffee, and Wa W jects, the Mayor, Capital Burgeffes, and Free-men, of the ancient Borough of Camelford, condole with your Majetty on the Death of your Royal Grandfather, our late most gracious Sovereign.

We congratulate your Majefty upon your Acceffion to the Crown of these Realms; rejoicing to have feen the Day, when a British-born Prince of the Houle of Hanover, afcended the Throne of His Anceftors in that Illuftrious Line. Your Majefty's Succession, by gradering and uniting the Sentiments of all your Subjects, hath completed the Solidity of that happy Eftablifhmest, by which the Liberties of Great Britain were fecured, and the Circumflance of your Majefly's Birth among us cannot but endear your Moral and Princely Qualities to the Hearts of your People, warming their Loyaltv and Elleem into an affectionate. Zeal for your Perfon and Government. The Opening of your Majefty's Reign hath produced fuch fubftantial Inftances of a difiniterested Dignity truly Royal, and of patriotic Attention to amend any Defects which the Care of " former Times might have overlooked in the Frame of our Constitution, as fully justify the Preposseffions of your Subjects in your Majefty's Favour, and con-firm the pleafing Expectations they had formed of every political Felicity under your upright and wife Government. And though the Conduct of publick Affairs hath fallen, in an arduous and critical Conjuncture, upon your Majesty's early Age; yet, far from being discouraged by the Confideration of your Majesty's Youth, we derive from thence a new Satisfaction, in the humble Hope, that Providence will gracioufly vouch afe the more lafting Duration to the Exercise of your Royal Virtues, and prolong the Bleffings of your Reign to our Pokerity in a very re-mote Period of Time.

Lisbon, April 2. On Tuefday last, the 31st past, about Twelve o' Clock at Noon, this City was alarmed with a Shock of an Earthquake, which lafted 4 or 5 Minutes. The Motion was horizontal, and pretty ftrong, but has done no other Damage than the throwing down fome old Walls : This is by fir the longeft that has been felt fince the 1ft of November 1755, though not to be compared, either in Strength or Duration, to the first that happened that Day. There have been feveral small Shocks fince. Their most Faithful Majesties, and the rest of the Royal Family, are in perfect Health. All the British Subjects are fafe and well, and their Houfes very little damaged. The Inhabitants, who were at first put into great Consternation, very soon recovered themfelves, and Bufinefs immediately went on as usual.

Hague, April 21. We hear that the Troops of his Pruffian Majefty have gained another Advantage over Part of the Army of the Empire. On the 6th Inftant, a Detachment of the former attacked the Corps under General Guafco near Plauen in the Voigtland, took 1 Colonel, 8 other Officers, with about 150 Men, and 4 Pieces of Cannon, and all their Baggage. The Pruffians loft, on this Occasion, only Major Hunt of Zietten's Huslars, a Lieutenant, and 30 Men.

Schomberg Houfe, April 21. This Day Baron Wittorff. Envoy Extraordinary from the Landgrave of Hefle Caffel, had his Audience of Leave of his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland.

To which he was introduced by Stephen Cottrell Efq; Affiftant Mafter of the Ceremonies.

Admiralty Office, April 25. His Majefty's Ship the Blonde, commanded by Capt. Kennedy, on the 20 h paft, fell in with a French Privatier, of 12 Corriage Guns and 116 Men, in the Latitude of 42° 30" North, about 60 Leagues to the Wellward of Cape Finisterre, and took her after a Chace of about fix Hours.
