Whitehall, August 4, 1761. ATE last Night the Directors of the East India Company received Difpatches over Land, from the Fresident and Council of Bombay, giving an Account of the Sur-render of Mihie on the 10th Day of February laft, with all its Dependencies, on the Coaft of Malabar, by M. Louet. Commander in Chief of the French Garrison of that Place, to Thomas Hodges, Eig; Commander at. Tellicherry, and to Hector Munro, Efq; Commander of the King's and Company's Troops on that Expedition.

Duffeldorp, July 26. Prince Soubize's Army, for Dujetarrp, July 20. Fince countre's Army, for Want of Provisions, has been obliged to retire to Menden on the Roer, that he may be nearer his Magazines. M. de Voyer has been detached with Twenty-fix Battalions, and a proportionable Number of Squadrons, to keep open the Communication with this Town and Cologne.

Cologue, July 27. The French, to conceal the Loss they fuffained in the late Battle, bring in their wounded Officers as well as Soldiers in the Night. However, we know the Number of the former brought into our Holpitals exceed Two Hundred; of the latter there are near Three Thoufand.

Hague, July 31. Letters from the Army, of the 28th paft, fay, that M. de Soubize, after having fent a great Reinforcement to Marshal Broglio, had passed the Roer, and was retired into the Mountains. Mar-thal Broglio had affemiled at. his Troops 2+ Paderborn ; and Prince Ferdinand was in full March after him. Colonel Freytag had deftroyed 50 Boats laden with Ammunition and Corn, and burnt the French him. Magazines on the Fuld, and the Werra. He did not lofe a fingle Man in that Expedition.

The last Letters from Silefia are of the 18th, when the Austrians and Russians had not been able to effectuate their Junction ; and that Part of the Pruffian Army, which was placed on the Right and Left of the Oder, near Breflau, continued to occupy the Posts affigned to them. The Van-Guard of the Rullian Army was advanced as far as Wartenberg. The King of Pruffia was at Pultzen.

The Ruffian Corps under M. Romanzow, defign-ed to at ack Colberg, had not begun its Operations the 12th of laft Month. The Swedes were in Motion, and were faid to have actually paffed the Peyne. Every Thing was quiet in Saxony. Prince Henry kept his Politi in at Schlettau; and Marshal Daun, and the Army of the Empire, had not yet begun to move.
