the People were obliged to quit her the next Morning, and all got fafe on Shore on the Effex Coast near Clacton, except a Woman Passenger, who was drow and in attempting to get into the Boat. That the Earl of Rochford, Vice Admiral of the County of Essex, upon his receiving Information of this Misfortune, sent off two large Sloops and his own Yacht to the Assistance of the Brig, and thereby faved great Part of her Cargo, which is secured at Brighlingsea; but that the Vesfel was stripped of all her Sails and Rigging by one Richard Watson of Gravesend, Master of a Cod Smack, and one Bull of London, Mafter of the Otter Sloop, who went on Board her before the Arrival of the Vessels sent by Lord Rochford; which said Sails and Rigging were afterwards feen in the Possession of these Men by his Lordship's Deputy Vice-Admiral, who boarded their Vessels.
