## From Tuchay March 23, to Saturday March 27, 1762.

Westminster, March 24.

HIS Day His Majefty came to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Septimus Robinfon, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to,

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for

the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters. An AT for the Regulation of His Majefty's Marine Forces, while on Shore.

An Act for appointing Commissioners for putting in Ex-ecution an Act of this Session of Parliament, intituled, An A? for granting an Aid to His Majefty, by a Land Tax, to be raifed in Great Britain, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-two.

An Act to prevent vexatious Proceedings against Brewers, Victuallers, and others, with respect to the Prices of Beer and Ale; for better securing the Revenue upon Strong Beer and Ale, by preventing fraudulent mixing thereof; to repeat fo much of an AA; made in the First Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as extends to certain Provisions relative to the Exportation of Similar Line Line States and State Spirituous Liquors, to the Exportation of Strong Beer and A'e, and for the more effectual preventing the re-landing of Beer, Ale, Cyder, and Mum, shipped for Exportation as Merchandize.

An Act for rendering more effectual feveral Acts paffed in the Fifth Year of His late Majefly King George the First, and the Thirteenth Year of His late Majestly King George the Second, for repairing the Roads from the Top of Stakeschurch Hill, to Enflow Bridge, through the City of Oxford, by Begbrooke, to New Woodflock in the County of Oxon, and for repairing the Road, from the Crown Aleboufe, to the Turnpike on Stokenchurch Hill aforefaid, and for repairing the Mile Ways on each Side the faid City, as therein mentioned.

An Act for repairing and widening feveral Roads, in the Counties of Cornwall and Devon, leading to the Bersugh of Saltafs in the County of Cornwall.

An Art for repairing, widening, and altering, the Read from Saudon, in the County of Stafford, to Bullock Smithy, in the County of Cheffer, and from Hilderftone, to Draycott in the Moors, and from Wetley Rocks, to Tean, is the field County of Stafferd.

An Ast for amending, and widening, the Road, from the Turnitic Road at, or near, the Town of Swindon, to the North End or Side of the Town of Marlborough, and from the faid Town of Marlborough, to the Village of Evenley, in the County of Wills.

An A.3 for refairing, and widening, the Roads, from a certain Place near Bolton in the Moors, to Leigh, and thence to the Guide Post near Golbourne Dale, and to the South East of Newton Bridge, and from the faid Guide Poff, to Winwick, and from Newton, by Parr Socks, to the Guide Poff, in Parr, in the County Palatize of Lansafter.

An Act for repairing and widening the Road, from the Losswitchiel Turnpike Road, in the Parish of Creed, in the County of Cornwall, through Tregony, to Ruan Lanchorne, and from Dennis Water to three hundred Yards on the South Side of Trethim Mill, in the Parifb of Saint Just in the faid County.

An AE for repairing, widening, and altering, feveral Roads, leading from Tawiflock, to Plymouth, and other Places, in the County of Devon.

An Act for amending, widening, and keeping in Re-pair, the Road, from Cafile freet, at the End of the Town of Hinckley, to Lutterworth Town's End, and from, or near, the Guide Poft, at Walcot Town's End, in the County of Leicefter, to the Eighty Mile Stone in Welford Field, in the County of Northampton.

An Act to amend and render more effectual, an Act paffed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act for amending, widening, and keeping in Repair, the Road leading from Fisherton Bridge, to the Turnpike Road at Willoughby Hedge, in Weft Knoyle, and from Wilton Bridge, to the Turnpike Road at the West End of Hestesbury; and also the Road from the Turnpike Road; at the Top of Red Hone Hill, in the Parish of Urshfont, to the Mile Stone, at the Western End of Fisherton Street, in the County of Wilts.

Warren, in the County of Stafford. An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers granted by Two feveral Acts passed in the Sixih and Sixteenth Years of His late Majelly, for the more effectual repair-ing the Roads, leading from Wadefmill, in the County of Hertford, to Barley and Royflon, and for making the Jaid Acts wore offestual.

An Act for building a Bridge crofs the River Teefe, at, or near, the Ferry, in the Parifs of Stockton in the County of Durham.

An Act for better regulating the Poor, maintaining a Nightly Watch, lighting, paving, and cleanfing, the Streets, Rows, and Paffages, providing Fire Engines, and Firemen, and regulating the Hackney Coachmen, Chair-

men, Carmen, and Porters, within the City of Cheffer. An Act for the Enlightening the Streets, Lanes, and Paffages, within the Town and County of the Town of Nottingham.

An Act for Supplying the Town of Halifax with Water
