WHEREAS His Majefty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 2d of April laft, to direct, That the Bounties of Six Pounds for every able Seaman, and of Three Pounds for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to every fuch able and ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st Day of this Inftant, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men for the Service of His Majefty's Royal Navy: And also that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings should be continued to be paid to every able bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty Five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the faid 3 ill Day of this Inftant, voluntarily enter themfelves in like Manner to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Five Pounds for every able, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every ordinary Seaman, should continue to be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who may fecret themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant. - And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is near expiring; And it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome Time longer; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be pro-longed and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this Instant May, to the 31st Day of July next. And that the laid Bounties and Rewards be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's aforementioned Order in Council of the 2d of April last. Breflaw, May 19. The King of Pruffia continues at Bettlern, and his Army remains in their Quarters of Cantonment. Part of the Auftrian Army are faid to be encamped, with their Right at Kaltenbrunn, and their Left at Hoghen Posseritz; by which Position they cover Schweidnitz. We hear that the Corps of Prussians in the Higher Silefia, under the Command of Lieutenant General Verner, are advanced between Troppau and Ratibor.

Hague, June 4. By the last Letters from Madrid, which were of the 17th of May, the Lois of Mi-, randa, by the Accident of a Powder Magazine ta-king Fire, is confirmed. The Garrison confisted of 350 Men, regular Troops, with some few Militia. The Count de Cifuentes, Lieuteuant Colonel of Horfe, carried the News to the King of Spain, and was rewarded with the Rank of Colonel. After the Spanish General had got Possession of Miranda, he sent a Detachment of 4000 Men to invest Briganza, which was done the 10th of last Month ; but there is no News yet of the Surrender of that Place.

We have no Accounts as yet, of any Motions of Confequence, either in the Allied or French Armies.
