The 31st of October, Two Days after the Battle of Freyburg, the Prince of Stolberg received a Rein forcement of Five Regiments, which joined him at Frauentiein, where the Emprefs's Army was re-affembled. Prince A bert of Saxony commanded this Reinforcement.

The sit of this Month Count Neuwied arrived at Ka zenhaulen and at Meiffen, with the Body of Tracps which he had brought from Silefia into Saxon ; he took the Poficion of General Hulfen, who joined he Graad Army with his Troops.

Both the Officers and Private Men are in the most diftreffed Situation, almost without Meat, Drink, or Cloaths. The Letters add, that the Spaniards are in a worfe Condition than the French; and that the whole Army was marching towards Effremadura.
