Whereas on Wednesday the 1st Day of September last, whereas on Weanglay the life Day of September tays, about Eight of the Clock at Night, a might evident Outrage was committed on the Perfors of Joseph Manuel, of Iford in the Parish of Chift Church Twynham in the County of Southampton, Labourer, by a Gang of Supposed Smuglers, consisting of Eight Persons, who, (under Presence of being a Press Gang) in an outrageous Manner, forced open the Door of the House of William Manuel, Father of the said Joseph Manuel, as Ifora aforesaid, violently seized his Son the said Joseph Manuel; faid they were King's Men, and droged him by Force out of the House, carried bim across the Heath to the Sea Shore towards Fools, and forced him down to Bourn Mouth to a lonely House there, called the Decoypond House, notoriously frequented by Smuglers, acheec, after be had been some little Time confined, be was put into a Boat, afterwards thrown into the Sea, and then earried on board a Smugling Cutter called the Ranger Privateer of Guernsey, Thomas Donasti, Commander, and well known amongs the Smuglers b) the Name of the Dorcas Cutter, which scon after got under Soil and fut to Sea: That, in their Passage to Alderney, and after their Arrival there, the said Joseph Manu-lavas treated with great Cruelty, and would probably have been mardered, if some sew of the Crew releating had wot interposed: That the said Joseph Mancel awas compelled to fire off (with Invent, as it is supposed, to desiroy bim,) an overcharged Bin derbuss, which burst, and tore off his Left Thumb: That having been left in this Condition at Alderney, he found Means fine to scope from thence, and to return Beme.

This Outrage bawing been committee on Account of the faid Joseph Manuel's being supposed to have given Information to the Officers of the Revenue; and there being great Reason to believe that it was not (as some of them have declared) any References of their coun, that induced the Master and Crown of the Ranger, otherwife called the Dorcas Cutter, to commit this audacisus Outrage, but that they were bired or infligated to

do it by some of the principal Smuglers on that Part of the Cousts of Dorseyllire and Kamphices.

The Commissioners of His Majesty Englows, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, and so supposes the enormous Smugling now most audaciously carried on upon that Part of those Coasts, do hereby provide a Reward of Fifty Pounds, to any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the principal Offenders or Ringleaders of this Gaug, and more especially the Person who first entered the House of the Jaid William Manuel, and pretended to have the King's Authorityshe said I homus Donnals, who commanded the Vessel or Smugling Cutter when Joseph Munuel was fixed on Board, the Persons who threw him into the Sea, or who forced bim to fire off the owercharged Blandertuss above-mentioned; to be paid by the Receiver General of His Majeft; s Customs upon Conviction. And the foid Commissioners of His Majefy's Customs do also promise she like Reward of Fifty Pounds, to any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or easile to be discovered and apprehended, any of the Forsons by whose Means or Insligation any of the Offen bes before-mensioned were bired or induced to commit the faid Out-His Majefty's Customs upon Conwillion.
