

Whitehall, December 28, 1762.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that Everard Buckworth Herne, of Heveringland Hall, in the County of Norfolk, Esq; received, on the 13th of this Instant December, the following anonymous threatening Letter, directed and written as follows, viz.

" To

" Everard Buckworth Herne Esq

" at Heveringland

" near Aylsham

" with Speed

" Mr Hearne Take Notes that if you make any more Fuss about yure house and the Game as you have done and go on to take up pepel and carry them to the Justis we will blow out your Brains and burn down your Hous over you And if Bull'er or Darrant or My Lord fend any body to Prifon they shal meet with the same Sause by God for we are strong enoug to do for you all to take care How You behave"

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the same) who shall discover his or her Accomplice, or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And as a further Encouragement the said Everard Buckworth Herne, does hereby promise a Reward of Forty Pounds; and Lord Walpole, William Bulwer, and Thomas Durrant, Esquires, for themselves, offer a Reward of Twenty Pounds each, to any Person or Persons making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as above excepted) to be paid by them upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
