 to order the Bye Night Mails from London, which now  
 stop at Worcester, to be continued from thence to Led-  
 bury and Hereford, Public Notice is hereby given,  
 That the first Bye Night Mail for Ledbury and Here-  
 ford, will be forwarded from this Office, on Monday  
 the 28th Instant; and the first additional Mail to Lon-  
 don, will be forwarded from these Places, through  
 Worcester, on Tuesday the 1st of March next.

By this new Communication, the Towns of Hereford  
 and Ledbury will have a regular Correspondence with  
 London Six Times a Week; their Correspondence with  
 Gloucestershire, Worcestershire, great Part of Oxford-  
 shire, Warwickshire, Staffordshire, Shropshire, Cheshire,  
 North Wales, Lancashire, great Part of Westmoreland,  
 Somersetshire, Part of Wiltshire, Dorsetshire, and all  
 Parts of Devonshire and Cornwall will be accelerated:  
 The Correspondence of the Counties of Radnor, Breck-  
 nock, Carmarthen, and Pembroke, with Worcestershire,  
 Staffordshire, great Part of Oxfordshire and Warwick-  
 shire, Cheshire, Lancashire, and Part of Westmore-  
 land, will be also improved.

And whereas many Letters are illegally conveyed by  
 Carriers, Stage Coachmen, Boatmen, Dispersers of  
 Country News-papers, and others; Notice is hereby  
 given, That all Persons, collecting, conveying, or de-

The Honourable the House of Commons having, on  
 Monday the 7th Instant, come to the following Reso-  
 lution, viz.

"That all Persons, interested in, or intitled unto,  
 "any Bills payable in Course of the Navy, or Vic-  
 "tualling Offices, or for Transports, which were  
 "made out on or before the 31st Day of December  
 "last, who shall, on or before the 25th Day of  
 "March next, carry the same (after having had the  
 "Interest due thereupon computed, and marked upon  
 "the said Bills, at the Navy or Victualling Office  
 "respectively) to the Treasurer of His Majesty's  
 "Navy, to be marked and certified by him or his  
 "Paymaster and Cashier, to the Governor and Com-  
 "pany of the Bank of England, shall be intitled  
 "unto, and have an Annuity, transferable at the  
 "Bank of England, for the Principal and Interest  
 "due on the said Bills, after the Rate of Four Pounds  
 "per Centum per Annum, to commence from the  
 "25th Day of March next, payable Half Yearly,  
 "in Lieu of all other Interest, until redeemed by  
 "Parliament; the said Annuities to be charged  
 "upon the Sinking Fund; and the Sums, which  
 "shall be issued out of the Sinking Fund for  
 "Payment of the said Annuities, to be from Time  
 "to Time replaced out of the next Aids to be  
 "granted by Parliament."

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Ma-
