Ministers Plenipotentiary of Saxony intended to to convoke the Diet, he thought proper to send a Message, intimating his Delign of doing it himself, by a Clerk of the Chancery to all the Ministers, which they refused to receive, the Right of making fuch a Notification not being yet fettled. Notwithstanding this, the Minilters Plenipotentiary of Saxony and Cologne proceeded to convoke the Diet. The Elector of Treves also pretends to the Directory of the Empire on the Death of the Elector of Mentz ; but as his Suffrage is administred by Baron Lyncker, the Secretary of Legation of Treves contented himfelf with making a verbal Proteflation to the Minifters of Saxony and Cologne against the Convocation of the Diet made by them. The 10th at Noon, the Electoral College, as well as That of Princes, affembled in their own Right, and not by Virtue of the Convocation made by the Ministers Plenipotentiary of Mentz, Saxony, or Cologne, and agreed among theinfelves to adjourn till the 18th of

July, as is utual on this Occasion. Florence, June 11. The I'wo first Divisions of the Tufean Froops are arrived here from Germany. and the last is to follow in two Days ; there are few Italians among them, the greatett Part of those being

This Prince was born Count of Thun; he had been Bilhop only thirteen Months, during which Time he sheed great Zeal for cstablishing an exact Discipline among all the Ecclesiasticks of his Dio-cese, and died an Example of Piety and Refignation.
