Hamburg, February 28. Letters from Brunswick give an Account of the Arrival there of the Prince and Princess of Brunswick on Tuesday the 21st Instant in the Forenoon: Her Royal Highness was met at some Distance from the City, by the Reigning Duke, and the Hereditary Prince, who conducted the Princess, amidst the Acclamations of a numerous Concourfe of his Subjects, to the Palace.

On Thursday last the 23d Instant, M. de John, a Knight of the Order of Danebrog, one of his Danish Majesty's Privy Counsellors, and his Envoy Extraordinary in the Circle of Lower Saxony, died here, after a lingering Illness, in the 78th Year of his Age.

The Count D'Ostrog, a Polish Nobleman, passed through this City a few Days ago, in his Way to

Copenhagen and Stockholm; to which Courts he is going to notify, in Form, the Death of the King of Poland.

This Day Count Woronzow, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Empress of Russia, had an Audience of Leave of her Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales.

And M. de Grosse, his Successor in the same Character, had his First Audience.

To which they were introduced by Sir Charles Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Pursuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the 26th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, That Information has been sent to this Office, That on Saturday the 3d Instant, the Ship Gevalia, whereof Eric Dahl, of Gelfe in Sweden, was Master, of the Burthen of 300 Tons, which sailed from Hamburg with Ballast only, bound to St. Ubes in Portugal, drove on a Sand off Caister in the County of Norfolk, and lost her Rudder; and having Seven Feet Water in her Hold, the Master run her on Shore on the Main, in order to preserve the People.

Information hath also been sent to this Office, that on the same Day the Ship Sara Juliana, of Gottenburgh in Sweden, of the Burthen of 100 Tons, whereof Sver Maybom was Master, bound from Gottenburgh to the Isle of Man, with Pickled Herrings and Train Oil, was driven ashore on Winterton Beach in the County of Norfolk.
