WHEREAS some Ensigns, whose Places of Abode are not known, who have been some Time appointed to different Corps, have not yet joined their respective Regiments; This Method is taken to let them know, that it is the King's Pleasure that they do forthwith repair to their Duty with their Regiments, excepting only those who have obtained His Majesty's especial Leave.
