

His Majesty's Customs, or reserved by former Acts for His Majesty's Use: And in Case any Sea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant Sea Officers, belonging to any such Ship or Vessel, for whom any Shares of Seizures are hereby allowed, be absent at the Time of making such Seizure, the Share of such Sea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant Sea Officer, shall be cast into the Shares hereby allowed to the Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunsmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine or other Soldiers, and all other Persons doing Duty or assisting on board any such Ship or Vessel, to be equally divided amongst them: Provided, that if any Officer or Officers on Board of any such Ship or Sloop at the Time of making such Seizures, shall have more Commissions or Offices than One, he or they shall be intitled only to the Share which, according to the above-mentioned Distribution, shall belong to his or their respective superior Commissions or Offices. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to cause His Majesty's Pleasure hereby signified, to be duly complied with.

Berlin, October 6. A few Days ago Prince Repnin, Lieutenant-General in the Russian Service, and Minister from the Court of Russia to That of Spain, arrived here from Hamburg, in his Return to Petersburg. Last Wednesday Prince Czartorinsky, Grand Veneur of Lithuania, arrived in this Capital from Warsaw.

It is said, that the Orders which the Regiments that were to march on the 7th Instant, to Potsdam, had received, are countermanded, the King of Prussia having thought proper to put off the Review till the 12th of this Month.

And, as a farther Encouragement for bringing the Offenders to Justice, the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Bristol do hereby promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds, to be paid to any One of the Accomplishes, (except as above excepted) or to any other Person or Persons, who shall discover and apprehend any of the Offenders; to be paid by the Chamberlain of the said City of Bristol on Conviction.

Whereas my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, have received authentick Information, That on the 2^d of March last, about Seven o'Clock in the Evening, as a Ship called Birgitha Catherina, of Copenhagen, Captain P. A. Janfen, Commander, belonging to the Danish African Company, was coming from Amsterdam, and bound for Sale in Barbary, the said Ship was piratically and feloniously attacked on the High Sea near Dover, by a Vessel or Cutter which flewed English Colours, and of which the Crew seemed to be English, who by Force plundered and robbed the said Ship Birgitha Catherina of great Quantities of Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes to a very considerable Value, in Violation of the Laws of Nations.

Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring to Justice the Persons guilty of the said Piracy and Robbery, are pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds unto or among such Person or Persons, as shall, within Three Months from this Time, discover any of the Offenders guilty of the above-mentioned Offence, so as such Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof: Which Reward shall be paid, clear of all Deductions whatsoever, by Samuel Seddon, Esq; Secretary of the Admiralty, immediately after the Conviction of such Offenders.

And as a farther Encouragement, His Majesty is pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of the said Offenders, (other than and except the Commander of the said Cutter) who shall discover, and procure to Conviction, any two or more of the said Offenders.
