cers and Seamen who fhall make any fuch Seizure. in fuch Proportions; and in fuch Manner, as His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors; shall think fit to order and direct, by any Order or Orders of Council, or by any Proclamation or Proclamations to be made or iffued from Time to Time for that Purpole : And whereas by one other Act passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, entituled, "An Act for granting certain Duties in the British Colonies and Plan-" tations in America, for continuing, amending and " making perpetual an Act passed in the Sixth Year to the Reign of his late Majesty King George the \* Second, (intituled, An Act for the better fecuring \* and encouraging the Trade of His Majefty's Su-" gar Colonies in America) for applying the Produce " of fuch Duties, and of the Duties to arife by Vir-tue of the faid Act, towards defraying the Expences " of defending, protecting, and fecuring, the faid " Colonies and Plantations; for explaining an Act " made in the Twenty Fifth Year of the Reign of <sup>43</sup> Made in the Fwenty Fill Fear of the Kegh of <sup>44</sup> King Charles the Second, (initialed, An Act for <sup>45</sup> the Encouragement of the Greenland and Eafland <sup>47</sup> Trades, and for the better fecuring the Plantation. <sup>46</sup> Trade,) and for altering and difallowing feveral <sup>46</sup> Drawbacks on Exports from this Kingdom, and <sup>47</sup> more effectually preventing the clandefine Con-<sup>46</sup> veyance of Goods to and from the faid Colonies <sup>46</sup> and four the dimension and fearing the " and Plantations, and improving and fecuring the " Trade between the fame and Great Britain"; it is. amonght other Things enacted, That all Penalties and Forfeitures inflicted by that, or any other Act or Acts of Parliament relating to the Trade and Revenues of the British Colonies or Plantations in America, which shall be incurred and recovered there, (except fuch Seizures as shall be made at Sea by the Commanders or Officers of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels of War duly authorized to make Seizures) shall be divided, after deducting the Charges of Profecution from the Grofs Produce thereof, into three Parts; and that one Part of the nett Produce thereof should be paid into the Hands of the Collector of His Majefty's Cultoms at the Port or Place where fuch Penalties or Forfeitures should be recovered for the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors; one other Third to the Governor of the Colony, and the other Third to the Seizer or Profecutor ; and that one Moiety of all fuch Seizures as should be made at Sea by His Majesty's Ships and Vessels as aforefaid, and of the Penalties and Forfeitures recovered thereon, first deducting the Charges as aforefaid, shall be paid as aforefaid to the Collector of His Majefty's Customs, to and for the Use of His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors ; and the other Moiety to him or them who fhall Seize, Inform, and Sue for the fame, fubject neverthelefs to fuch Diftribution of the Produce of the Seizures fo made at Sea, as well with Regard to the Moiety therein before granted to His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, as with Regard to the other Moiety given to the Seizer or Profecutor, as His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors shall think fit to order and direct by any Order or Orders of Council, or by any Proclamation or Proclamations to be made for that Purpofe; His Majesty taking the fame into his Royal Confideration, is hereby pleafed, purfuant to the Powers vefted in him by the faid Acts of Parliament, and by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, direct and appoint, that the Moiety, or other Part of all and every the Seize e and Seizures that have been, or fhall be made by Virtue of the first mentioned Act, and granted to the Officers and Seamen as aforefaid, and the Moiety of Seizures granted by the faid last mentioned Act, be divided in the following Proportions, viz.

if. With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers and Men of Ships and Sloops of War.

To the Captain or Captains of any fuch Ships of Sloops who shall be actually on Board at the Seizure of any Smugging Veffel or prohibited Goeds, Three Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea Lieutenants and Mafters on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongft them : To the Lieutenants and Quarter Masters of Marines, and Lieutenants, Enfigns, and Quarter Matters of Land Forces, Boatswain, Gunner, Purser, Carpenter, Master's Mate, Surgeon, Pilot, and Chaplain, on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Midshipmen, Secretary to Flag Officers, Captain's Clerk, Master Sailmaker, Carpenter's Mates, Boatfwain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Mafter at Arms, Corporals, Yeomen of the Sheets, Coxfwain, Quarter Mafters, Quarter Mafter's Mates, Surgeon's Mates, Yeomen of the Powder Room, and Serjeants of Marines, or Land Forces on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, One Eighth Part to be equally divided amongft them : To the Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Car-penter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunfmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine, or other Soldiers, and all other Perfons doing Duty, or affifting on Board any fuch Ships or Sloops, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them.

zd. With Regard to Seizures made by the Officers and Men of Cutters commanded by Lieutenants.

To the Lieutenant commanding fuch Cutter, who fhall be actually on Board at the Seizure of any Smuggling Veffel, or Prohibited Goods, One Half Part: To the Second Master and Pilot, or Master's Mate and the Midshipmen on Board any such Cutter, One Eighth Part : The Second Master and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate, to have Two Third Parts thereof, and the Midshipman to have the Remainder; but if there should happen to be a Pilot Extraordinary on Board at the making of any fuch Seizure, the Second Mafter and Pilot, or Mafter's Mate, is, in that Cafe, to have one Moiety of the faid Eighth Part, and the other Moiety is to be equally divided between the Pilot Extraordinary and Midshipman : To the Clerk and Steward, Boatiwain's Mate, Gunner's Mate, Car<sup>2</sup> penter's Mate, and Surgeon's Mate on Board any fuch Cutter, One Eighth Part: To the Able Seamen. Ordinary Seamen, and all other Perfons doing Duty and affifting on Board any fuch Cutter, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them.

3d. With regard to Seizures made by Ships or Sloops of War in Conjunction with Cutters,

That in all fush Cafes, the Moiety or other Part which is given to the Officers and Men who shall make fuch Seizure, be divided into so many equal Parts or Shares, as there may be Ships or Sloops and Cutters concerned therein; and that those Shares be distributed to the Officers and Men of the Ships or Sloops and Cutters according to the aforegoing Proportions.

And His Majeffy doth hereby further order, directs and appoint, That in the Cafe of Seizures made at Sea in any of the Colonies Abroad, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, by His Majeffy's Ships or Veffels, being Part of the Squadron, or acting under the Orders of a Flag Officer, or a Commodore with a Captain under him, fuch Flag Officer or Commodore thall have One Fourth Part of the Moiety or other Part of the faid Seizures directed by the faid laff mentioned Act to be paid to the Collector of His Majeffy's
