And it is also further enacted, that all and every Perfon and Perfons, who shall print, paint, or flain any Paper in Great Britain as aforefaid, for Sale or not for Sale, shall give or leave Notice in Writing, at the Office for the faid Duties on Paper next to the Place where fuch Paper shall be printed, painted, or flained, of whir respective Names and Places of Abode, and the Place where they shall respectively print, paint, or stuin any such Paper as aforesaid, before they respectively do presume to print, paint, or stain the same; to the End the Commiffioners, or other Officers for the faid Duties on Paper, may, from Time to Time, have due Knowledge of all the Places where fuch Goods shall be wrought, and be the better enabled to secure the Duties thereby granted thereinpon: And if any fuck Perfor or Perfons, who shall print, paint, or stain any Paper for which a Duty ought to be paid by the faid Acts, shall neglect to give or leave such Notice as aforefaid, he, she, or they shall, for every such Offence, forfeit the Sum of 30 1. And it is further enasted, that all and every Per-301. And it is further enacted, that all and every Per-fon and Perfons, who fhall print, paint, or flain any Paper as aforefaid in Great Britain, fhall once in every fix Weeks make a true Entry in Writing, at the next Office for the faid Duties upon Paper, of all the Paper by him, her, or them feverally made fit for Ufe within juch fix Weeks respectively; which Entries shall contain the just Kinds and Quantities thereof. on Poin to forfit the just Kinds and Quantities thereof, on Pain to forfeit, on every Neglest of fuch Entry, the Sum of 50 l. which Entries shall be made upon Oath, or upon Affirmation. And whereas by an Ast paffed in the 1st Year of the Reign of his Majesty King George the First, among other Things, for preventing Frauds in the Duties relating to printed or painted Paper, &c. it is enabled, that no Perfon or Perfons, who shall print, paint, stain, or dye any Paper chargeable with the faid Duty, shall remove, carry, or fend away, or fuffer to be removed, carried, or fent away, any Paper by him, her, or them printed, painted, or stained respectively, until such Time as the proper Officer shall have taken an Account of every particular Quantity of fuch Paper fo to be carried away, and until every particular Piece and Parcel of fuch Pa-per shall be duly marked with fuch Stamp or Seal as per poals of any marked with Juch Stamp or Seal as aforefaid, denoting the Charging of the faid Duty, on Pain to forfeit 201. for every fuch Offence; and that all the printed, painted, or flained Paper, so carried away without being marked with fuch Stamp or Seal denoting the Charging of the faid Duty, and being in the Poffefion of any Stationer, or other Trader or Dealer therein, or of any other Person or Persons for the 116 therein, or of any other Person or Persons for the Use of such Stationer, Trader, or Dealer, for Sale, shall and may be seized and recovered one Moiety thereof for the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, and the other Moiety for the Use of the Seizer or Informer.

And whereas there is Reason to believe, that several Perfons practife the Painting of Paper for Hanging Rooms, without making the Entries or paying the Duties afore-aid, whereby they incur the Penalties inflicted by the jaid Laws;

and pay the Duties aforefaid, will be profecuted as the laid Laws direct.
