Westminster, January 28.

HIS Day His Majefty came to the Houle of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Septimus Robinson, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Affent 10,

An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter; from Ireland; for a limited Time.

Constantinople, December 15. The new Ve-netian Bailo arrived here last Week, and has made his Notification in Form to the Porte and the Foreign Ministers.

Lifbon, January 7. After a long Series of dry Weather for many Months, the Rains fet in about the Middle of December with great Violence, and have continued ever fince. The Bar at the Mouth of the River has been fo high, that no Veff. I could put to Sea. On the 26th we had a violent Storm from the North-Weft, which about Eleven o'Clock ended in a ftark Calm, and in about a Quarter of an Hour after fucceeded a fhort, but most alarming Shock of an Earthquake in a perpendicular Direction; however, as it providentially lasted but a very few Seconds of Time, no material Damage enfued. We have had all along, from Time to Time, fmall Shocks; but this, though one of the shortest, was the most violent we have felt for many Years ; which may reafonably be imputed to a long Drought for near eight Months fucceffively.

On the 18th of December, one of his most Faithful Majesty's Ships, called Nossa Senhora das Brotas, arrived in Thirty-one Days from the Rio de Janeiro with about Four Millions of Cruzadoes for the Commerce.

On Saturday the 22d of December, there was a publick Execution of feveral Criminals, who were brought fome Time ago from Cabo Verde, and were tried before the Regedor, or Lord Chief Juffice, in the Court of Relaçum, for the Murder of John Vieira de Andrade, the Judge of those Islands, on the 13th of December, 1762.

Dublin, January 18.

Yesterday being the Day appointed for cele-brating Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the Flag was

displayed on Birmingham Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majefty's Park the Phœnix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments on Duty, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: At Noon there was a very fplendid Appearance of the Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction, at the Caftle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Juffice; and an Ode was performed upon the Occasion. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, Ringing of Bells, and every other Demonstration of Joy.
