Stockholm, April 30. HE King came to Town on Sunday Evening, to be prefent at the Anni-versary Ceremony of his Orders; but no new Knights were to be inftalled on this Occafion. All the Royal Family, except the Prince Royal, were at the Comedy Yesterday Evening, and afterwards returned to Ulrickfdahl.

Copenhagen, May 7. The Queen Dowager, who has been much indifposed during all the laft Winter, is now pretty well recovered, and intends to remove next Week to Hirscholm, her ufual Place of Refidence in Summer. The two Princes will also foon fet out for Friderickfberg.

Count Wurmbrant, the Imperial Minister, will accompany his Lady to Vienna, where fhe is going to lye-in; and Baron Sellich, who is charged with the Affairs of the Imperial Court during that Minister's Absence, was presentedby him Yesterday to Baron Bernstorff.

M. d'Often, the Danish Envoy at Petersburgh, is recalled, and is to be fucceeded in the

fame Character by Baron d'Asseburg. Naples, May 7. Commodore Harrison in the Centurion, and Captain Elliot in the Thames Frigate, are arrived here; and on Sunday the Commodore was prefented to his Sicilian Majefty, who was pleafed to allow him the Entrée after Dinner.
