The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Day the Right Honourable Thomas Pelham, Elq; Comptroller of His Majefty's Household, was, by His Majesty's Command, fworn of His Majefty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Florence, August 17. Many Edicts have been published with regard to the Regulation of this Town ; by one, all milerable Objects of Beggars are prohibited to be exposed in the Streets, and a Maintenance is provided for them in an Hospital: By another, all Coffee-houses, and public Places of Refort, are to be fhut at One o'Clock in the Morning.

Florence, August 24. By Letters from Rome we have Notice, that on Monday last the Pope was feized with a Fit, which totally deprived him, for many Hours, of his Senfes; but, by three copious Emiffions of Blood, he recovered them to as to receive all the Sacraments of the Church with the greateft Refignation and Tranquility of Mind ; but tho', at the Departure of the Courier that Evening, he continued in that Situation, and had not had any Return of his Fits, neverthelefs he was supposed to be in the most imminent Danger.

The Marchionefs Riccardi and Madame Antinori, who were lately appointed Ladies of Honor to the Arch-dutchefs, fet out this Morning for Bolfano, to attend that Princels from thence, in Confequence of an Order which they received laft Week for that Purpofe.

St. Ildephonso, August 19. His Carbolick Majefty has received the News of the Princels of Parma's being landed at Carthagena the 11th; and fhe will be here the 25th. The Marriage will be performed the fame Day; and in a Day or two afterwards the Marquis de Santa Cruz, a Grandee of Spain of the First Class, and Gentleman of the Bed-Chamber to the Prince of Afturias, will be fent to Paris to notify the Marriage.

Venice, August 23. A Tripoline Corfair lately took a small Neapolitan Vessel in the Adriatick. But a Venetian Man of War falling in with him, when he had the Neapolitan in Tow, retook the Veffel and reftored her to the Neapolitans, forced the Tripoline into an Harbour, where he detained him till he was affured to what Nation he belonged, and then

Turin, August 24. The Courier dispatched to Madrid from the Court of Parma being returned, the Duke of Parma received, on the 9th Instant, the Oath of Allegiance and Fidelity of all his People, and took the Reins of Government, declaring himfelf come to a State of Majority.

Hague, September 3. The Hereditary Prince and Princels of Brunswick arrived in perfect Health, on Saturday Evening, at the Houfe in the Wood, near this Town, where the Prince of Orange received them; and their Royal and Serene Highness have continued to lodge there. The Duke of York arrived early on Sunday Morning from Germany, but preferred to lodge in Town, as he had done when his Royal Highnefs was here before.

The Hereditary Prince and Princess fet out this Evening for Helvoetfluys, where they go by Water, in the Prince of Orange's Yachts : The Duke of York by Land To-morrow Morning; and his Excellency Sir Joseph Yorke attends them to the Place of their Embarkation.

St. James's, September 7. By a Letter from Dunkirk received Yefterday, we learn, that the Demolition of the Jettees of the Channel of Durikirk was begun the 2d Instant.
