ON Thursday Evening Prince Kaunitz was taken ill of a Fever, but has gradually abated since the second Bleeding, and is in no Manner of Danger.

The Emperor has been pleased to make Count Stahrenberg the Imperial Ambassador at Paris, and Prince Poniatowski, Princes of the Empire.

Dresden, December 11. Prince Clement, the Elector's Uncle, left this Place last Monday, to return to his Residence at Freysingen.

Berlin, December 14. M. de Zegelin, who is appointed by the King of Prussia to be his Minister at the Porte, set out from hence a few Days ago for Constantinople.

Yesterday Prince Henry of Prussia set out from this Place for Potsdam, to pay a Visit to the King of Prussia his Brother.

Hamburg, December 17. Yesterday M. de Zoge, the Swedish Minister, delivered his Recredential Letters to the Senate, and afterwards paid a Visit to his Colleagues. He proposes to set out in a Week's Time for Stockholm.

M. Hecht, the Prussian Minister, is preparing to make a Tour to Berlin.
