Copenhagen, October 4.

N the 1st Instant the Marriage-Ceremony between their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Sweden, and the Princess Sophia Magdalena of Denmark, was relebrated, by Proxy, in the Chapel Royal of Christiansburg, in Copenhagen. Prince Frederick of Denmark was Proxy upon this Occasion.

A Succession of Entertainments has fince then been given by the Court and the Ministers of the Council. The Swedish Ambassador is to have the Honour of presenting one to the Royal Family To-morrow: He is to accompany the Princes to Helsinborg on Wednesday the 7th Instant.

Berlin, October 4. On Thursday the 2d Inflant his Prussian Majesty came to Charlottenbourg, but did not receive any of the Foreign Ministers; and last Night he was present at the Representation of Caius Fabricius in the Opera-House here; after which he returned to Charlottenbourg, and this Morning early he set out sor Potzdam, as did also the Prince and Princess Royal of Prussia.

The Margrave of Anspach, who has been here for some Days, visiting the Queen of Prusia and the Rest of the Royal Family, took Leave list Night, and set out this Morning on his Return to his own Dominions.

Hague, October 10. Yesterday Morning, a little before Nine o'Clock, the Queen of Denmark landed fafely at Rotterdam, from whence her Majesty sat out for Utrecht, in the Prince of Urange's Yacht, between Ten and Eleven before Noon. The Prince of Orange, the Prince and Princess of Nassau Weilbourg, and Prince Lewis of Brunswick, received her Majesty on he Landing, and conducted her to the Apartment in the Admiralty-House, which the Magiffrates of Rotterdam had fixed upon as the most convenient for her Majesty to arrive at, and where the was pleased to receive the Compliments of the Regency of that City. Princels of Weilbourg accompanied the Queen through the Town to her Yacht, amidst the Acclamations of the People, where the Prince of Orange again received her Majesty, and took CUSTOM-HOUSE, LONDON.
