**T**HIS Court went into Mourning on the 30th past, for Fifteen Days, on Account of the Death of his late Highness the Duke of Holstein

Glucksburg; Count Catanti, the Neapolitan Envoy, had his Audiences of his Danish Majesty on Monday the 1st Instant.

M. de Philosoffoff arrived here on the 4th.

The Ship Sophia Magdalena, belonging to this East-India Company, failed the Beginning of this Week for Canton.

*Dresden, December 7.* Wednesday last having been the Prince Administrator's Name-day, the Court, according to a Custom of late practised by them on such Occasions, went early in the Morning into the Country, and spent the Day in the Diversion of Hunting. In the Evening they returned to a French Comic Opera. The Theatre was grandly illuminated, and there was an Heroic Ballet, which finished with a Piece of Machinery, exposing to View Kaverio, the Name of his Royal Highness.
