The Marquis de Malagon Ambestador from his Catholique Majesty had a private Audience the same evening, that he arrived, both from his Imperial Majefty, and the Empress Dowager, the next night the Ambassadors Lady was brought to bed with a Sonne, His publique Entry as 'tis thought will be deferred till the Emperors Marriage be over 3 he has brought with him several Letters of exchange, for the raising of 12 Regiments for the service of his Master to be employed in Flanders, in case the King of France should make any attempt upon them there.

Monsieur Balbitsky Ambassador from the King of Swede-land continues still indisposed, and attends only some remission from his distemper, being it seems resolved to leave this Court without any farther ceremony, or making more demands in order to the affaires of his Master, in which he hisnot yet had any fatisfaction.

From Hungary we are informed, that Balaffi Imbry is carried from the Fort of Marack, where he has been some mouths a prisoner, and by a Guard of 100 German soot, and 200 Hayduks conveyed to the Castle of Bresbourgh, from whence we may suddenly expect news either of being acquitted or condemned, it not being easy to divine which of them, the party for him being as numerous as those against him.

The solemn Entry of the Empress ( as 'tis said here ) is to be deferred till the 16 cf December, till which time she is to be entertsined at Neustadt, with all the divertisements of huntings and other recreations: The Emperor has sp-pointed for Bridemen to the Empress, the Prince of Lorraine and the Duke Maximilian of Baviere, both of them are making preparations to appear in the greatest splendor they are able, His Imperial Majisty being pleased to affish the latter with 30000 Florins towards his expences at that ceremony.

Some disputes having of late risen between the Republiques of Venice and Genona, about the Trade into the Levanz: The Venezian Ambassador has offered to his Imperial Made On the Control of the Property of t perial Majesty the reference of that affaire as Umpire, so as to stand to his award in case the other Arbitrators they shall choose enteach side cannot determine it.

A Turkish Ambassador is designed hither, with fifty perci fons in his company, with prefents to the Emperor, and to congratulate him upon his Matriage; and was already upon his way, but having intelligence lent him, that the time of her arrival was not yet fully known, he has put a stop to his journey, till he can be informed of the certainty.

Paris, Novemb. 19. The Fort lately raised at Breft, for the security of the Fleet that lie there, is brought to a good perf. Ction, and 25 Guns planted on it. All the Navy is at prefert difarmed, except twelve of their leffer frip; who are to be commanded by the Sieur du Quefne for the security of the Merchants, and a squadron of the Sieur d'Almeras which are to lie on Brouage side.

Order is taken for the paying of all Officers, Soldiers, and Marriners, and for the building of five Men of War at Breft; three at Soubige, and five at Thoulon ; which with the fix thips built at Amsterdam, and four others bought of the King of Denmark, are to reinsorce the Fleet for the next Summers ervice.

Monfieur de la Renie, one of the Mafters of Requests,is a hout ten days hence to go from this place by order from his Ma jesty, with two able Bugeniers, to visit all the Ports of France : and itis said, the King has a design to make the Port of Blaye (very consi erable already for its scituation) capable to entertain 1000 ships; and to secure them against all wea-

His Majesty has given a Commission to the Sieur de la Roche (newly returned from England, where he was prisoner) to command the fix thips built at Amsterdam, and the four bought at Denmark, and to put them ou: to Sea.

The chief Prefilent of Provence has fent a Remonstrance to the Council, shewing, That that Province cannot be in a condition of paying his Majesty the yearly present they were wont to make him, unless his Majesty give them permission to transport their Corn and Cloth into foreign parts, France not being a place to fell them in.

The Chamber des Grands Jours having cited the Count de Roure, his Majesties Lieutenant in Languedoc, to appear personally before them : He has refused, returning them in answer, that the employment of his charge, in his Majesties service, required his presence actually where he was; and in that respect he was to be excused from attending them.

The Count de Ruelus arrefted the laft week by order from the Chamber, was this week with a strong guard, commanded by the Provost of the Isle, conducted into the Country. They have already sentenced the Country Polignas, but he has obtained a Decree of the Council, by which his Mijesty hath referved that bufinels for his own hearing.

This week his Majesty hath had a review of his Guards, and is expected this day at the Thuilleries; but 'tis not yet known whither he intends to refide here this year.

Naples, Novemb. 2. The new Arfenal advances much by the care of the Viceroy, and is like to be of much advantage for the security of our shipping; and to oblige the King of Spain in surthering the work, Seignior D. Cefare Caraccielo has sent 150 of his people to work at it without any pay, but onely the ordinary allowance of diet.
