**T**HE Chevalier de Macedonio, Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Naples to the Court of Portugal, is come hither in his Way to Lisbon, and has been presented at the Pardo to all the Royal Family.

Last Week an Express, arrived from Corunna, brought Advice of the safe Arrival of the Flota at the Havanna, excepting two Ships, which had been dismasted, and were put back to Vera Cruz.
