Copenhagen, January 31. The Prince of Brunswick Bevren arrived here a few Days since from his Government of Rendsburg; as did Count Schmettau, Commander in Chief of the Forces in Norway, from thence.

Count Welsberg, Minister Plenipotentiary from the Court of Vienna, arrived here on the 28th, and has already made his Visits to the Foreign Ministers

His Excellency M. Desmercieres, Deputy in the College of Commerce, and one of the Directors of the Bank, has just resigned the former of those Employments.

Turin, February 11. Early last Saturday Morning, we had here a very sensible Shock of an Earthquake, which lasted about three Seconds. It has been felt more severely at Genoa, where it has done a little Damage to some of the Houses.

Hamburg, February 13. The Population of this City has not increased this Year, as it appears, that 3427 Persons have died, and that only 2983 Children have been born; 1079 Couple have been married.

Lugus, February 17. The Marquis d'Havincour, Ambassador from his most Christian Majesty to the States-General, died here on Sunday last in the Afternoon, of the Small-Pox, sincerely regretted by all Ranks of People for his good Qualities: The Ambassador, never having had that Disease, had been obliged to leave the House at the Request of her Husband, and will probably return to France with her two Sons.

The Annual Fast will be observed Tomorrow throughout these Provinces.

War-Office, February 24, 1767.

IT is His Majesty's Pleasure, that all Officers, whether taken from the Half-Pay or otherwise who have been appointed to any Regiment in the British Establishment, but en Stations out of Great Britain, and whose Commissions are dated on or before the 1st Day of October, 1766, shall set out, within one Month from the Date hereof, to join the Corps to which they belong, except they have already obtained the King's Leave of Absence, or unless they shall now obtain it through the Application of their Colonels; which Application is not to be made except on very cogent Reasons. And all Officers belonging to the above-mentioned Regiments who have now Leave of Absence from their respective superior Officer commanding where the Regiment is stationed, (if no particular Time is specified for such Leave) are to apply through their Colonels, that the Time may be ascertained by the King, and before the Expiration of the Time so limited, they are to join their Corps. It being His Majesty's firm Resolution to supercede any Officer who shall disobey these his Orders.

All future Leaves of Absence are to be exactly regulated according to His Majesty's Orders, bearing Date the 11th Day of February, 1767.
