Thursday the 5th of March last for out from thence the next Day, on his Result to Air, in Company with Mr. William Herries, Merchant at Ayr, and John Mac Murtrie, Tide-Officer at the Jame Place; That, about Seven o'Click in the Evening of the Jame Day, (the 6th of March) when the Jaid Perfons were near the Parks of Fullment these more from belief the Parks of Fullarton, there were, from behind a Hedge, Two different Guns fired at them, by which the Horse of William Herries was shot dead on the Spot; That, thereupon, the said Gordon and Mac Martie galloped away, and the said Herries was seized by Four or Five Persons armed, who expressed the most determined Resolution instantly to murder him, (Supposing him to be the faid Alexander Gordon) but, on being convinced by him of their Mistake, some of them rade after the said Mr. Gordon, but happily did not evertake him; That a Precognition of this Matter having been taken by the Sheriff of Ayr, it was discovered, in the Course thereof, that Four of the Person, supposed to have been guilty of this Crime, have absconded, who, it is said, went on Board an Irish Strop called the Royal George, which, about the Beginning of April last, surgeled a Cargo at the Troon Peint; and that such Smuggling Vessels from Ireland generally rendericus at Rufs, femitimes at the Skerries, and femitimes at Dublin; That it is highly probable, from the Evidence in the faid Precognition, that thefe Four Men were concerned in the Design of Affassing the faid Mr. Gordon; and also that many more were in that Confriency against him: His Majesty therefore, for the better differenting and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said wicked.
