“ From a Friend unknown

“ Sir I hope you Excuse me for sending you these Lines which is to warne you of the Danger you are in for so often promising payment of the Prize Money for the Galoone — and not keeping your Word — there is now A great number assembled together with A Resalution to have satisfaction of your Person — The first Proposall was to set your house on fire but they Concidrd that would avall nothing for it might be more Predgidysal to your inifont Neighbours than to you — so they have agreed to set a watch to know whear you are at all hours of the Day and Night and when it Is conveneant the will Cum in a bod and tak you : but not willing to Cum mit Murder they will let you of with the Lofs of your Tongue your 2 Eyes and your Right Arme — Every one is sworn to be true before the know what was to be Don I am one who Chanced to have the misfortune to Cum to the Sociaty and was sworn before I knew what was on foot and not willing to be guilty of such Crualty I therefore tak this Opetunety of aquenting you before the Lots is Drown Lest it should Cum to my Lot to do the Deed So Sir Excuse my Name Your frend

“ P S June 14th. 1767

“ Sir I would advise you To give them Satisfaction if you can or elce make your ascape before next Week.”

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in Writing the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
