Excise-Office, London, July 6, 1767.

The Commissioners of Excise do hereby give Notice, that Attendance will be given this Day, and for Thirty Days afterwards, (Sundays and Holidays excepted) at the Excise-Office in the Old Jewry, London, from Eight o'Clock in the Morning till Two in the Afternoon, for receiving such fresh Notices, Entries, and Duties, as are required by Act of Parliament passed in the 20th Year of the Reign of his late Majesty, for laying a Duty of Five Shillings upon every Hundred Ounces of Plate, which any Person or Persons, Bodies Politick or Corporate, shall own, use, have, or keep, within the Li-

mits of the said Chief Office of Excise. And the like Attendance will also be given at the several Offices of Excise in England, Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, for receiving the like Notices, Entries, and Duties from the several Persons, Bodies Politick or Corporate, not inhabiting or being situate within the Limits of the said Chief Office of Excise.

Custom-House, London, June 20, 1767.

Whereas on Wednesday the 13th Day of May last, between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Evening, John Case, John Liddell, Thomas Harton, William Webber, and David Brown, all Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and belonging to the Fly Cutter, in the Service of the Revenue, being on Board a Boat belonging to the said Cutter, within the Limits of the Port of Portsmouth, and in the proper Execution and Discharge of their Duty, were hindered and obstructed by the Crew of a Barge, which they observed to put off from one of the Men of War then lying at Spüthead; on Board of which Barge were several Casks, which the Officers suspected to have been then lately run, and which they attempted to seize, but in such Attempt were forcibly opposed and obstructed.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of Fifty Pounds to any Person who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the said Offenders; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction.

And if any one of the said Offenders shall within Three Months from the Date hereof, discover his Accomplices, so that two of them at least be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence, the Offender making such Discovery, shall be entitled to the like Reward, and be discharged of such his Offence.
