

Berlin, July 25. Yesterday his Prussian Majesty came from Potsdam to Charlottenbourg, where in the Evening there was a Drawing-Room on Account of the Marriage of the Princess Louisa Henrietta Wilhelmina, second Daughter of the Margrave Henry of Brandenburg, with the Reigning Prince of Anhalt Dessau, which is to be solemnized this Night at the same Place.

Hague, July 28. Their Royal and Serene Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Brunswick are safely arrived, with the Prince their Son, in perfect Health, at Brunswick.

Hague, July 31. The Prince of Orange arrived here on Wednesday last in the Afternoon, in perfect Health. His Serene Highness was welcomed into Town with the Firing of Cannon, Ringing of Bells, and the Displaying of Colours from the Steeples, and in all the Streets. The next Morning he was complimented by Deputations from the States-General, the States of Holland, and all the other Colleges, upon the Notification he had given of his Marriage; and the Rejoicings upon the Occasion continued two Nights.
