Copenhagen, September 26. M. de Rantzau, Son in Law of M. Thott. died here ome Days ago. The Post of Bailiff of Wor-M. de cinburg, which he enjoyed, has been given to II. de Brokenhusen.

Liston, September 26. On Sunday last, an Auto da Fé was celebrated here, in which deven Men and three Women received Sentence. Not one was condemned to die; and nost of them were convicted of Offences, for which much heavier Punishments would have been inflicted on them, had they been proceeded against in the King's Temporal Courts. Since his most Faithful Majesty's Accession, the Burning of Hereticks has been disused.

Berlin, October 3. Last Thursday his Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, attended by eight of the principal Officers of his Household, and about fifty Domesticks of all Denominations, arrived at Potzdam, where he dined with the King of Pruffla; and the next Day he came with that Monarch to Berlin, where he was introduced to the Prince's Wilhelmina, in the Presence of the Royal Family only. In the Evening there was a Ball in the Queen of Prussa's Apartments, to which the Nobility and Foreign Ministers were invited; and it is said the Maringe will be celebrated To-morrow Evening.
