Immediately after it was made known, the Foreign Ministers, and all the N bility, waited upon the King, who was pleased to receive their Compliments of Congratulation, and to express the Satisfaction received from their Attention on this interesting Event. The King of Denmark bestowed several Marks of Favour on this happy Occasion. M. Vander Luhe was invested with the Order of the Elephant: Count Holck, elder Brother of the Marshal, and the Chamberlain Schavaliczky, had that of Dannebrone: The Counts of Ahlefeld, Moltke, and M. Lerche, were raifed to the Rank of Chamberlain.

Berlin, January 20.
