THE Hanover-Packet, Captain Todd, arrived here on Saturday last, in Seven Days, from Falmouth. The Royal Family are all in good Health at Ajuda; and on the 19th (the King's Name-Day) their most Faithful Majesties received the Compliments of a very numerous Court.

Hague, April 12. The States-General have given the Rank of Major-General of Horse in their Service to Prince Frederick, youngest Son to the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel.

M. Hop, Son to the late Lieutenant-General who resided so many Years in England as Minister from the States-General, is named to succeed M. Mauritius as the Republick's Resident at Hamburgh.

The Reigning Prince of Waldeck, who is a Major-General, and has Four Battalions of his Troops in the Dutch Service, arrived here two Days ago with his youngest Brother, who is in the Hanoverian Service; as did also Count Rechten, the Republick's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Ruffia.
