AST Tuesday Morning the Regiments of Lottum and Koschenbar, Infantry, that of the Gens d'Armes, with a Squadron of the Gardes du Corps, Cavalry, the Regiment of Ziethen, Huffars, and a Corps of Artillery, marched from hence to Potzdam, where, together with the Garrison of that Place, they were to be exercised and manœuvred, during several Days, before his Prussian Majesty.

Count Czernichew, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Empress of Russia to the King, arrived here on the 21st Instant, on his Way to London. He is accompanied by his Lady and Children, and a great Number of Attendants. His Excellency, after paying his Court to the King of Prussia, intends to go from hence to Dresden, Leipzick, and Frankfort on the Mayn.
