Berlin, September 24.

LAST Tuesday Morning the Regiments of Lottum and Koschenbar, Infantry, that of the Gens d'Armes, with a Squadron of the Gardes du Corps, Cavalry, the Regiment of Ziethen, Hussars, and a Corps of Artillery, marched from hence to Potsdam, where, together with the Garrison of that Place, they were to be exercised and manoeuvred, during several Days, before his Prussian Majesty.

Count Czernichew, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Empress of Russia to the King, arrived here on the 21st Instant, on his Way to London. He is accompanied by his Lady and Children, and a great Number of Attendants. His Excellency, after paying his Court to the King of Prussia, intends to go from hence to Dresden, Leipzick, and Frankfort on the Mayn.

Hamburg, September 27. M. Von Spreckelsen, Doctor at Law, was this Day elected a Member of the Senate, in the Room of Senator Rentzel, who died here Yesterday Se'nnight.
