HIS Day being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, who entered into the Ninth Year of His Reign, there was a very numerous and brilliant Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Dissinction, to compliment His Majesty on the Occasion. At Noon the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.
