ter may end there, effecially if we have no pleafing news from the Armics. Our Letters from Gennary cell us, I hat the Duke of Lorigia was preparing to march with the Imperial Army into I orrain, before the French on that fine be in a const ion to oppose him. From Vienna they write, That the Emperor, has been very much indifpoled of late; and though it's faid that fince his having been let blood, he is much better, yet fome Letters affine the contrary.

Ghent, May 13. We have received feveral Letters from the Army, which give give us this account: I hat on Thurday, the 7th indiant, the Prince of Orange comman ed the Prince of Viudemont to march privately about Noon with 3000 Horfe and Foot, to fecure a Passover the River Schelde below Conde, and at the fame time ordered the Duke of Holllein to march with 1500 Horfe, and two Regiments of Foot, through Mons, directly towards Kicurain, to amuse the Enemy, and to perfuade them that our Army wasc ming to attack them on that fide, and that the faid Duke had the Van. About feven in the Evening the Army was fuddenly ordered to decamp, which was accordingly done, and matched towards Conde, without found of Trumpet, or beat of Drum, that the lefs notice might be taken of ir. The Army marched in two Lines, the Spanish Troops being on the right, the Prince of Orange on the left, and the Baggage, that is the Artillery, Ammunition, and feveral Wagons laden with Provisions (for the reft of the Baggage remained at Mons) in the middle ; in the Night the Duke of Holftein, who had advanced as far as the great Hill between Mons and Kieurain without any Rencounter repassed the Haifne at St Guislain, and rejoined the Army, which the next morning encamped between Permetz and Bascques, about a League from Gonde, upon advice that the Marelchal d'Humieres was very advantageoufly posted with 7 or 8000 Men, to guard the Pals which the Prince of Vaudemant was sent out before to posses himself of, in order to the Armies pailing the River there. There his Highnels and Excellency received an account, that the Molt Chrittian King had drawn his Forces from Kiearain, Sebourg, &c and was marched towards Bouchain, to fecure the Siege, and that Monlieur de Louvoy paried from Conde to the French Camp the night before. On Saturday in the afternoon his Highnels and Excellency were informed, that Maresthal Humieres had quitted the Pass, and was retreated towards Bouchain; upon which, our Army immediately decamped, and marching by Conde, paffed the Schelde, almost under the Cannon of that place, the Prince of Orange advanced that night to Valenciennes in great hafte, upon an account he received, that the French were going to posses themselves of a certain Hill near that City, but his Excellency came not up with the Spanish Troops till Sunday morning, having been hindred through the breaking of some of their Bridges, as they were passing the schelde near Conde. While the Army marched on Friday morning, a French party of 16 Horfe came up within Piltol thot of the Count of Naffaw, who was at the head of the Dutch Cavalry, but it cost the Officer that commanded, and feven or eight of the party their lives, and the reft were taken. The Baron de Quincy likewise fell in with fome of our Troops with 500 Horfe and Dragoons but loft feveral of his men. Our fresheft Letters from the Camp, are dated near Valenciennes yesterday at Noon; they key, that the Armies lay encamped in a plain open Countrey, in fight of each other ; that the French had intrenched themfelves; that our Army had a Wood on is richt, which was possessed by 3000 of our Foor; har two Batteries had been raifed on our fide upon the

Hill near Valencienres; and that both Parties gave inch o her frequent Salutes of their Cannon, though they were at too for a diffiance to do any great excution, that on Monday roon they heard to more flooting from Louel at a, which we look upon as an ill fign, for the Guns had been plainly heard ever fince the Beliegers begun their Barteries, till then.

Hagne May 12. We at prefers talk or think of little News here, but what we receive and exptd from *Blandars*; the laft account was, that the Moft Christian King, epon the march of the Pince of $O_{1,a}$, had quitted his Camp at Kews an, and was retreated rowards B schain, to ji in his ' orces employed in that Siege, having left the Marcfohal d Humieses with 8000 Men, to guard a cottain Pafs, which he afterwards quitted, as low king uj on himfelf too weak to realatain i; and that on Sunday our Army arrived at Valengiennes.

Pa.is, May 13. Our lait Letters from Flanders tell us, that the Prince of Grazge was advanced with his Army to Val Edicanes, and that his Majefly having quitted his Camp at Schong, and paffed the Schelde atout a League below Valencemes, had poffed himfelf between that place and Bonchain, to hinder all relief to the Befieged, that-the two Armies lay in fight of each other, and that it was every hour expected fome action would pafs between them. Bonchain held out fill, and the Befieged made a good defence; but in all probability, our next Letters will give us an account, that the place is taken. From Germany they write, that Philiphing is clofely blocked ap, and that the Enemies are going to work on their 1 line of Citeunvallation to firaiten it the more. We are told here, as if there were a milinderflanding between the Bishop of Mathfer and the Euke of Zull, and that this is the realon they do not take in hand the Siege of Stade. The Fortifications of Schiftsdain Alfaria are now almoft in thir perfection, and the Duke of Larrenbug affembtes his Army in that Neightorhood, in order to his being in the Field the 15 inflant.
