Stockholm, August 15.

A MEDAL was this Day ordered by the States to be struck, in Commemoration of the 25th Year of their Majesties Marriage.

The Court will return To-morrow to Dronningholm for some Days.

Naples, August 15. On Sunday last, being the Birth-day of the Queen of Naples, there was a grand Gala and Baciamano's at this Court: Their Sicilian Majesties dined in Publick, and went to the Opera at Night, when the Great Theatre was magnificently illuminated.

Copenhagen, August 19. The Court returned to Fredericksberg on Saturday last, and will continue there till the 20th of September.

Genoa, August 19. On the 17th Instant M. Beninelli Spinola set out for Parma, with the Character of Minister Plenipotentiary from this Republick, to compliment the Duke and Dutchess on Occasion of their Nuptials.

The Republick, in Conjunction with the Directors of the Bank of St. George of this City, have granted the Sum of Fifteen Thousand Scudis of Silver (about Four Thousand Five Hundred Pounds Sterling) for clearing the Port of Savona; the East and South-East Winds having filled that Port with such a Quantity of Sand, that the Gallies cannot lay in the Port.

A Vessel is arrived this Week from Civitta Vecchia, and has brought an Augustin Friar, whose Name is Anthony Cortes, who had been demanded by the King of Spain of the late Pope, and was refused to be delivered: The present Pope has consented to deliver him up, and he is to be conducted in Chains to Barcelona.

By a Vessel arrived from Trapani there is Advice, that Two Maltese Gallies had taken Two Tunisian Gallies with their Crews, and was performing Quarantine in Trapani.—His Britannick Majesty's Ship Montreal sailed last Night for Leghorn.

Turin, August 23. Her Royal Highness the Dutchess of Savoy has been indisposed some Days past, but is this Day much better.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Chablais set out last Monday to view the Fortifications and mountainous Parts of his Sardinian Majesty's Dominions towards Genoa. It is thought he will be absent about Three Weeks.

Hague, August 29. The States of this Province will assemble To-morrow, and the Prince of Orange is expected here on the 4th of next Month; but his Serene Highness will stay but three or four Days.

Coblentz, August 29. About Seven last Night the Cannon of Ehrenbreitstein and of this Town announced, by a Triple Discharge, the Arrival of the Elector of Mentz. The Soldiers and Burghers were all under Arms. His Electoral Highness was received at the Coach-Door by the Elector of Trier, who conducted him to an Apartment prepared for him in the Palace. Soon after the Elector of Trier made his Electoral Highness a Visit, which was immediately returned; and then they both waited on her Royal Highness the Princess Comtesse, where the Court were assembled to receive the Elector of Mentz. At Nine o'Clock the Ladies and Gentlemen drew for their Places at

Table, and Sixty-two Persons supped there. It is said his Electoral Highness will remain here till Saturday: Great Preparations are making to render his Stay agreeable.

Hamburgh, August 29. His Serene Highness the Reigning Duke of Holstein Glucksbourg arrived here a few Days ago from Nassau Saarbruck, with his Comfort, a Princess of that House; and their Serene Highnesses intend to set out next Thursday from hence for their Residence.

The two young Counts Rosamowski, Sons of the late well known Hetmann of the Cossacks, who have studied at Strasbourg, arrived also in this City a few Days ago, and proceeded Yesterday on their Return to Petersbourg by the Way of Denmark and Sweden.
