Escurial, November 9. AST Saturday, being St. Charles's Day, there was a grand Gala at Court; and though the Roads were exceedingly bad by the Continuance of wet Weather, yet most of the Persons of Distinction came from Madrid upon the Occasion.

St. James's, November 25, 1769. General Post-Office, November 24, 1769, General Foil-Omee, November 24, 1709, Whereas a Bill of Exchange, supposed to be felomously taken out of the Mail distaiched from this Office for Ireland on Friday the 3d Instant, (which Mail was foreibly taken from one of the Sailers (clonging to the Packet II berry as he was carrying it from the find II berry to the Post Office in Dublin, on Wederstay the Sch Indian A hash here effected to be protested in London 8th Inflant.) but been effered to be negotiated in London by four Persons answering the following Descriptions,

One of them dreffed in a brick dust coloured Great Coat with a New-Market Cape, and a black Coat under it, mint coloured Stockings, and a pia.n Har, is about 5 Feet 10 Inches high, wears his own Hair, of a dark brown Colour fied behind, thin Face, fresh Complexion, and between 30 and 40 Years of

Another of them had on a reddiffi mixt coloured Coat, green Breeches, mortled Silk Stockings, his Finir of a lightish brown Colour, tied behind, about 5 Fret 8 Inches high, and between 30 and 40 Years of Age.

Another of them had on a light coloured Great Coat, a dark brown Under Coat, a Pair of dirty Leather Breeches, dark mixt coloured Stockings, a light coloures Wig, a plain Hat flapped before, and a red Handkereinef about his Neck, is about 5 Feet or 8 Inches high, fresh Complexion, and seemed rather bloated with Liquor, between 30 and 40 Years of Age.

And the other dreffed in a grey coloured Great Coat, a dark coloured fecond-mourning Coat, with black Buttons and Button-holes, dirty Leather Breeches, dark grey coloured Stockings, and a dark rown frizzled Wig, is about 5 Feet 4 or 7 Inches high, thick-fet, and of a pale Complexion.
