WHEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, entitled, "An Act for registering the Prices at which Corn is sold in the several Counties of Great Britain, and the Quantity exported and imported," It was enacted, That the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, shall, from Time to Time, appoint a fit Person to receive at the Treasury such Returns of the Prices of Corn, and of the Quantity exported and imported, as by the said Act are directed to be made; the first Appointment to be made before the first Day of August, 1770, and published Eight Times, at the least, in the London Gazette; Notice is therefore hereby given, in Pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have appointed William Cooke, Esq; to receive, at the Treasury, such Returns of the Prices of Corn, and of the Quantities exported and imported, as are directed by the said Act of Parliament.

Paris, July 22. The Dauphin's Health being pretty well restored, his Most Christian Majesty went to settle at Compeigne on Friday last.

The Scarcity of Corn, and the Dearness of Bread, in several Provinces of the Kingdom, have excited Riots and Complaints in different Parts: His Most Christian Majesty has issued an Arrêt du Conseil, prohibiting the Exportation, and permitting Importation, till farther Orders.
